MONTRÉAL

Walk the cobblestone streets of North America's oldest walled city. Québec's old center became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985, an indication of its rich and unique history. Be sure to visit both the Haute-Ville atop Cap Diamant and the Basse-Ville along the banks of the St. Lawrence River, the oldest part of town. Leave Québec City and continue to Montréal, the province's economic center. Since the early days of the fur trade, Montréal's location on the St. Lawrence River has made it the commercial hub of the vast region north of Hudson Bay and west to the Rocky Mountains. The Vieux Port, where Montréal was originally founded by Paul de Chomedey, Sieur de Maisonneuve, still breathes the air of days gone by. Enjoy a small city tour of Montréal in the late afternoon including photo stops at the Place Jacques Cartier and Notre Dame Basilica.



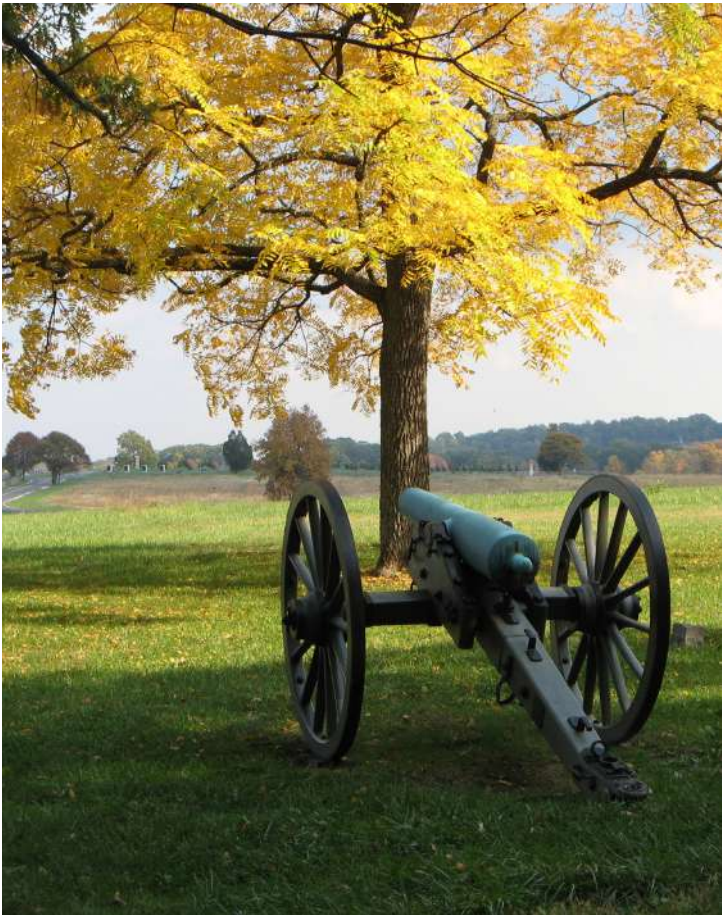

The tour leaves York and travels through the fertile farmlands and industrial communities of south central Pennsylvania. 300 Years ago, members of religious groups persecuted in Europe settled here to lead a life focused on religion and farming; today, these people are collectively known as the Pennsylvania Dutch. Visit an Amish Museum (admission included) in Lancaster County, the center of a plain, centuries-old way of life. Head south crossing the state of Maryland, then continue to America's capital, Washington, in the District of Columbia. In the first years of the republic, it was agreed that a capital city should be built halfway between the northern and the southern states. George Washington, the first American president, commissioned his friend Pierre L' Enfant to plan a city worthy of the new nation's capital. Decades after the city was founded, the beauty of L'Enfant's planning became apparent, allowing the city's structure to gradually develop and grow to its present size.

George Washington, commander in chief of American forces in the Revolutionary War and the first president of the United States, called Mount Vernon home for more than 40 years. George Washington and his wife Martha Washington lived at Mount Vernon, which is now the most popular historic estate in America. Situated along the Potomac River in Northern Virginia, Mount Vernon is just 16 miles south of Washington, D.C.

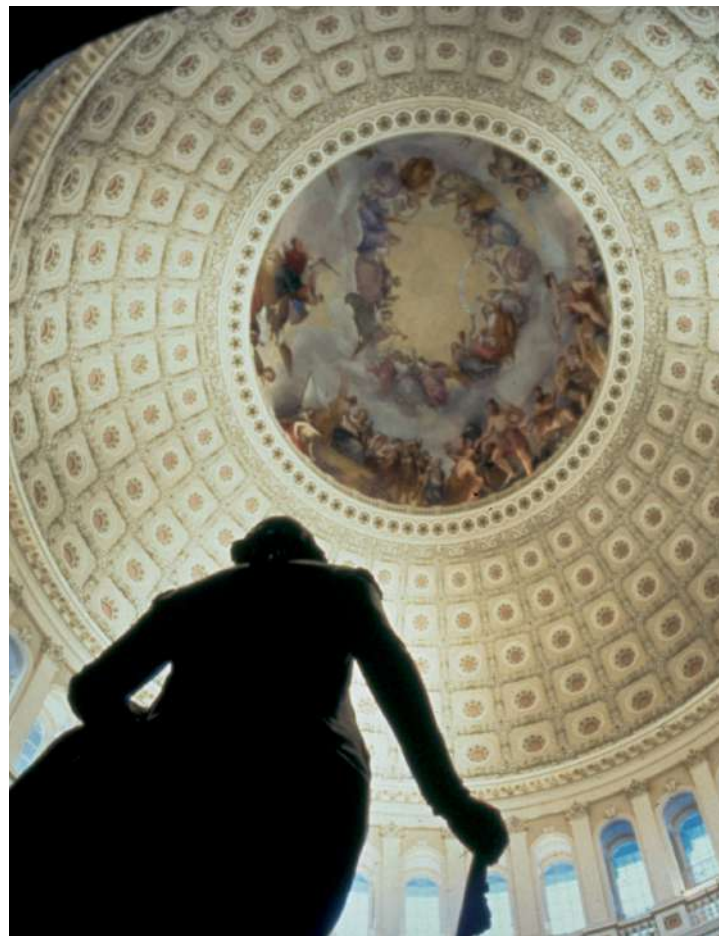
Today, guests to Mount Vernon can visit the Mansion, more than a dozen original structures, Washington's Tomb, and nearly 50 acres of his extensive plantation. The estate also includes a working blacksmith shop and the Pioneer Farm, a 4-acre demonstration farm with a reconstructed slave cabin and 16-sided treading barn.

The Ford Orientation Center features an inspiring film, *We Fight To Be Free*. The Donald W. Reynolds Museum and Education Center is home to 25 theaters and galleries, which tell the detailed story of George Washington's life with more than 500 original artifacts, 11 video presentations, and even an immersion theater experience.

Just 3 miles down the road from the Mansion, George Washington's Distillery & Gristmill have been reconstructed and are open seasonally. Both fully functioning, Washington's fascinating mill and distillery tell their story of Washington as a master entrepreneur.

Mount Vernon is an American landmark and a lasting reminder of the life and legacy of the Father of Our Country. Visit Mount Vernon, and discover the real George Washington.

Cross the Potomac River into the state of Virginia. Virginia played a central role in the early history of the United States. In 1609, British Colonists established Jamestown, the first permanent settlement in the New World. Virginia's Patrick Henry delivered his famous "Liberty or Death" speech in Richmond in 1775. The Revolutionary War and the Civil War both ended in Virginia, and four of the nation's first five presidents came from this state. Travel on to Williamsburg, which served as the capital of Virginia from 1699 to 1780. 173 acres of the old town have been meticulously restored, creating America's largest outdoor museum, where costumed actors recreate the characters of Colonial times. In the afternoon, head east across the Piedmont region of Virginia, which was once an important tobacco-growing region and is now a rapidly developing urban area, where many smaller towns and cities dot the landscape. Climb through the Appalachians, a series of mountain ranges that extend parallel to the Atlantic from Maine to northern Georgia to the Shenandoah Valley on the far end of the Blue Ridge, the highest range in this part of Virginia. There, nestled in the western slopes of the mountains you will overnight.

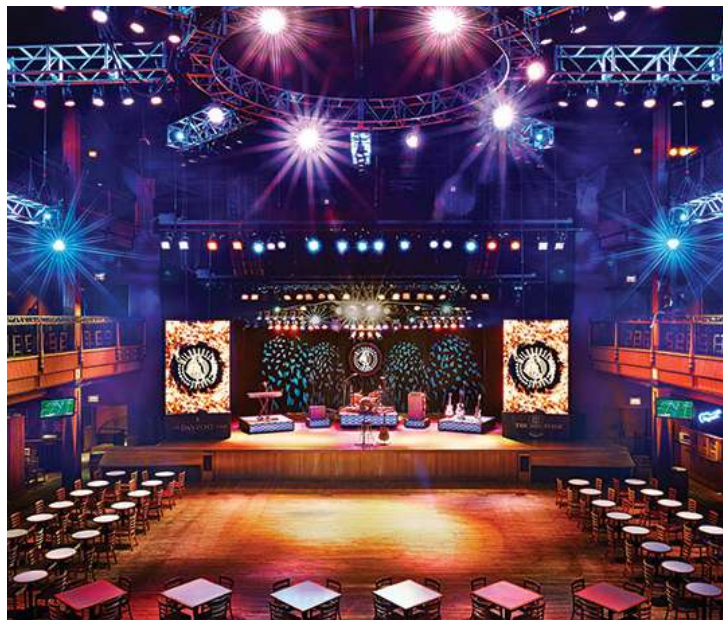

This 65-acre estate is known for its beautiful home and prize winning rose gardens. Continue through Mobile. Founded in 1702, Mobile rapidly became one of the most important ports along the Gulf Coast. It played a crucial role for the Confederacy during the Civil War. A month's long battle over Mobile ended with the city's surrender to the Union on April 12, 1865. Continue on to Pensacola, one of Florida's most important vacation destinations. Spanish colonists founded Pensacola in 1599, and they created the first European settlement here. 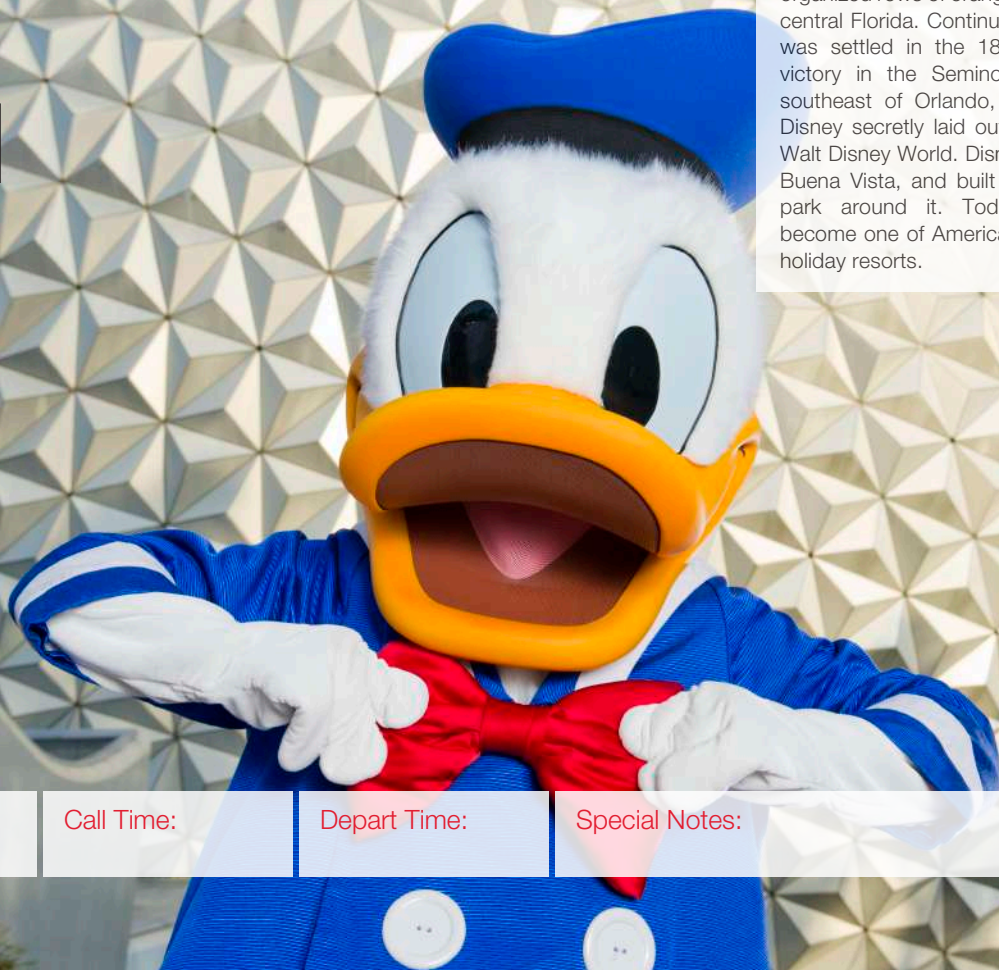
