

Welcome to the United States

We wish to extend a hearty welcome to our international visitors and we wish you a pleasant stay in our beautiful country.

The attached offers you some general information about the tour itself, your scheduled itinerary, optional services, as well as some helpful hints concerning American customs. By observing these guidelines, we hope to make the tour as enjoyable as possible.

We know you have many choices for your travel plans but thank you for allowing AlliedTPro to be your trusted travel service provider.



HOTELS: It is sometimes impossible for the entire tour party to be lodged in the same hotel. On occasions when hotel substitutions are made, we assure accommodations in the best available alternative hotel of similar standard.

Hotels will maintain a separate account for any meals or personal expenses not included in the program. Please be sure to pay any additional expenses directly to the hotel before checking out.

PORTERAGE: Hotel porterage for 1 bag per person is included. Passengers with additional suitcases will be charged \$4 per bag per day for each additional bag which will be collected at tour departure.

SEAT ROTATION: The policy of AlliedTPro, for all our tours and on all our coaches, is daily seat rotation. In the attempt to treat all participants equally, we ask that all travelers kindly familiarize themselves with our system of seat rotation. Your tour escort will supervise these seat changes, which will be done once or twice per day allowing all travelers to fair seating.

SMOKING: No smoking is permitted on tour coaches. We ask that passengers kindly confine their smoking to the regularly scheduled rest stops.

LAVATORY: In the interest of all passengers, we request that the lavatory on the bus be used only in emergencies. Regular rest stops will be made and we encourage participants to use the lavatory facilities provided at these stops.

OPTIONALS: Additional excursions and services are offered to further enhance your tour experience. These services are offered on an optional basis for which you may choose to pay either by cash or credit card.

TIPPING: Unlike most other countries, tips and gratuities for those working in the service industry are not included in the prices. This enables the client to make a better decision about the quality of service received and about the compensation for the service provider. Tipping should accurately reflect the quality of the service rendered. We offer the following suggestions as tipping guidelines hoping that you will find them helpful

Hotel personnel, Porters \$1.00 per suitcase
Taxi drivers 15-20% of fare cost
Waiters, waitresses 15-20% of the bill
Tour escort (per person) \$4.00-\$6.00 per day
Bus driver (per person) \$3.00-\$4.00 per day

Your tour documentation includes two envelopes, one for the guide and one for the driver. It is customary to hand the envelopes to the guide and driver as you leave the tour



DAY 1 MONDAY

New York City > Boston (215 m / 344 km)

Board the motorcoach, settle back and depart north into the New England states of Connecticut and Massachusetts. Upon arrival in Boston, enjoy a sightseeing tour of this historic city including Faneuil Hall, Boston Common and Harvard University. Evening at leisure for optional excursions.

DAY 2 TUESDAY

Boston > Québec City (392 m / 627 km)

Continue northward through New England, land of rolling green hills and rivers. Enter Canada and proceed to Québec City, a charming French city on the St. Lawrence River. Arrival is scheduled for early evening. Feel free to experience the international flavor of Québec City on a leisurely stroll.

DAY 3 WEDNESDAY

Québec City > Montréal (155 m / 248 km)

This morning enjoy a sightseeing tour of Québec City. Visit this historic and scenic city, including Old Québec, the fortifications and Battlefield Park. In the afternoon, depart Québec City traveling west to Montréal, the sophisticated, cosmopolitan center of the Québec province.

DAY 4 THURSDAY

Montréal > Ottawa (124 m / 200 km)

This morning, enjoy a sightseeing tour of Montréal, with its Old City and much more. Afterwards depart to Canada's capital – Ottawa. Upon arrival, sightseeing tour of Ottawa, including Canada's Parliament Hill and other sights.

DAY 5 FRIDAY

Ottawa > Toronto (280 m / 450 km)

Early departure to Toronto. Travel south towards the St. Lawrence River and along the shores of Lake Ontario to Toronto. A sightseeing tour of Toronto will show off this modern Canadian city of glass and steel (depending on time, sightseeing tour of Toronto may be moved to the next morning).

DAY 6 SATURDAY

Toronto > Buffalo (106 m / 170 km)

Today continue to Niagara Falls for an optional lunch with a panoramic view of the American and Canadian falls. Conclude your visit with a cruise on the Niagara River into the mist of the falls. In the afternoon, return to the United States for an overnight stay in Buffalo.

DAY 7 SUNDAY

Buffalo > Washington, D.C. (412 m / 659 km)

Depart Buffalo. In the morning, travel through rural upstate New York. Heading south through Pennsylvania, the tour will pass some beautiful countryside and varied scenery before arriving in Washington, D.C. in the early evening.

DAY 8 MONDAY

Washington, D.C.

The morning's panoramic sightseeing tour is devoted to the landmarks and monuments of this great city: the White House, the Washington Monument, Arlington Cemetery and the U.S. Capitol. Afternoon is free to explore one of the Smithsonian museums, such as the National Air and Space Museum.

DAY 9 TUESDAY

Washington, D.C. > Philadelphia > New York City (236 m / 379 km)

Travel north to Philadelphia, the birthplace of American Liberty. Famous sights include the Liberty Bell and Independence Hall, where the Declaration of Independence was signed and the U.S. Constitution was written. Arrive in New York in the late afternoon.
